Spring Term Newsletter 2022



We hope you like the new style of observations we put on Tapestry. We wanted to make them more parent friendly but also to capture your child's voice in their play.

We will still be adding your child's unique review every three months and like the observations we add, we value and take into account your feedback and thoughts. Additionally, you are more than welcome to make an appointment to meet with your child's Key-Person to discuss vour child's development.







Since the beginning of the Spring term, we have been trialling fresh fruit as opposed to cereal at morning snack time.
